



Weathering the Storm

Hurricane Harvey changed the lives of everyone in Houston, and Senior Rides and More was no exception. Many of our staff, board members, volunteers and care receivers suffered devastating flooding, and those who didn't flood themselves reached out to help others. Our caregivers are busy helping friends and family through the recovery and are often no longer able to devote as much time to Senior Rides.

The generosity of our caregivers during this difficult year cannot be overstated. Senior Rides continues to help more homebound seniors every year – and this year was no exception. Volunteers drove over 28,000 miles and devoted over 4,500 hours to help care receivers remain in their homes. We offer you our deepest gratitude and thanks.

To accommodate the growth in need during the past year, Senior Rides added a fulltime Program Director for the first time, participated in the Harris County Rides program, partnered with J-Ride through Jewish Family Services, and our Executive Director visited Austin and San Antonio to learn more about their Drive a Senior nonprofit programs, and to share information with them about our own Senior Rides and More work.

And then there was Harvey, and we had to grapple with all the problems the aftermath brought to Houston. As a consequence, 2018 promises to be a year in which to regroup and rebuild. The need for transportation and other services to keep seniors in their homes continues to grow. We are getting an ever-increasing number of calls from seniors wanting to participate in our program. So far, thanks to our wonderful volunteers and the taxicab program, we have been able to help all those eligible for our services. Everyone at Senior Rides is deeply grateful to our donors who enable us to offer the taxicab program to our care receivers at no cost to them.

As we work our way through the coming year, we ask for your help and your prayers. Houston seniors deserve to spend their last years comfortably and safely in their homes, and Senior Rides and More is committed to helping make this possible.

OUR MISSION

Senior Rides and More's mission is to promote senior independent living, health and safety by providing free transportation and other services. Because transportation is such a vital component of independent living and because over 90% of requests for service are for free transportation, our program has focused more and more on this area of service. Volunteers, using their own cars and gasoline, take seniors to doctors and clinics, to pick up prescriptions, to go grocery shopping or to food banks and to accomplish other transportation-dependent needs. Senior Rides and More is the only provider offering free senior transportation in our 31 zip-code southwest Houston service area and 11 zip-code northwest Houston service area.

ACCOMPLISHMENTS & HIGHLIGHTS IN 2017

In 2017, Senior Rides and More

Recruited and trained 12 of our 200 volunteers who helped 644 seniors

performed 3,228 care giving events

drove 35,241 miles

and donated 4,878 hours of service

In 2017, Senior Rides and More

- Assisted seniors in 31 zip codes in southwest Houston
- Assisted seniors in 11 zip codes in northwest Houston
- Benefited from over \$69,700 of in-kind donations
- Had administrative costs of less than 15% of total budget
- Helped seniors at a cost of just \$20 per month, per person
- Donated 6,601 free cab miles and 531 cab trips to assist care receivers when a volunteer was not available



ACCOMPLISHMENTS & HIGHLIGHTS IN 2017

<u>VALUES STATEMENTS.</u> We included two important values statements in our Strategic Plan; one that all services would be performed at no cost to care receivers, and the other that volunteers will always be the primary means of assisting care receivers.

<u>SENIOR HEALTH FAIR.</u> We participated in a Senior Health Fair to acquaint seniors with the services available to them.

<u>SHARING KNOWLEDGE.</u> Our Executive Director traveled to San Antonio and Austin to share information with them about our senior transportation program.

<u>ALTERNATIVE TRANSPORTATION.</u> We supplemented the work of our wonderful volunteers with our Special Transportation Program, Harris County Rides and "J" Rides, and using taxicabs when a volunteer was not available.

<u>GETTING THE WORD OUT.</u> We published four quarterly newsletters in print and internet format, keeping volunteers, supporters and donors aware of our programs.

VOLUNTEER THANK YOU. We hosted a volunteer thank you dinner to honor our volunteers.

<u>SOCIAL MEDIA.</u> We updated our Facebook page and our website to widen our appeal to the larger community, and we activated our Twitter and Instagram accounts.

<u>GIFT CARDS.</u> We provided grocery store gift cards to care receivers in need.

OUR CARE RECEIVERS

Senior Rides and More's care receivers are frail and elderly people who want to remain in their own homes but need a little help.

Over 90% are both elderly and disabled

75% are women, most of who live alone with no nearby family

All have "aged out" of their ability to drive or take public transportation

Their average income is less than \$1,500 per month

Senior Rides can help them "Age in Place" by providing needed transportation to doctors and clinics, to go grocery shopping and to pick up prescriptions.

Senior Rides and More has been helping seniors "age in place" for 24 years as illustrated by the following examples:

- A 90 year old female care receiver who lives in a retirement home and is legally blind due to macular degeneration receives weekly assistance getting her groceries and help with errands thanks to our volunteers.
- A husband and wife, ages 91 and 89, are both Senior Rides and More care receivers. He has slight dementia and depends on his wife; she has vision problems that prevent her from driving. Our SRAM volunteers provide them with transportation together for their medical appointment.







A SENIOR RIDES AND MORE Hero

We have many stories to tell about those we help, many of whom become like family to those who work in our office. One very recent story that moved us emotionally involves the close relationship between one of our longtime volunteers and the care receiver she has been helping for years. Laurel (our volunteer) had been helping Linda (our care receiver) for a few years and they became close friends. Linda is completely blind due to diabetes and lives alone in her own home with no family in Houston. During Harvey, Laurel became concerned about Linda but could not reach her by telephone. Linda's home did in fact flood and she had to be evacuated by boat (neighbors came to her rescue) and transported via dump truck (yes, dump truck) by city workers to the George R. Brown Convention Center. It took over 24 hours, but Laurel tracked Linda down and retrieved her from a bad situation at the GRB.

Laurel, our wonderful volunteer, brought Linda into her home to live and took full care of Linda for months after the flood. Laurel brought Linda's clothing and dry items into her own home, took Linda to her medical appointments, and contacted the insurance company on Linda's behalf. During the immediate aftermath of Harvey, the Senior Rides employees who were able to get to the office began calling on care receivers to check on their safety. Unable to reach Linda, our office called Laurel who then told us this story. Laurel gave Linda a home for four months before Linda left in December to live in North Carolina closer to family. We have so many volunteers who go out of their way to help our seniors, but Laurel's devotion has exceeded our expectations.



Sara Keene, Northwest Program Manager


