MISSION STATEMENT

Senior Rides and More is a faith-based nonprofit whose mission is to promote senior independent living, health and safety by providing free transportation and other services.

From the Desk of the Executive Director

2020 was quite the challenging year for many nonprofits, including Senior Rides and More. This

time last year my calendar was overflowing with several planned in-person meetings and events. Instead, I learned how to use Zoom video conferencing, and our office staff went into high gear to make sure our care receivers were safe while quarantining at home.

During the summer and fall of 2020, many of our volunteers showed an abundance of caution and either paused their volunteer activities or masked up and helped our care receivers from a distance. Senior Rides was very aware that having our

care receiver shop in-person was risking exposure to Covid19, therefore we added more options to our program: our care receivers could choose to shop in person; shop online and have our volunteers pick up the groceries for them; or have the items delivered to their home with Senior Rides paying the delivery fee.

Last year, the number of calls we received requesting rides to medical appointments dropped by 75%. Many of our seniors were introduced to Teledoc services by their medical providers, which was a blessing to those requiring non-emergency

medical attention or routine visits, but it meant that our primary service of transportation was declining. However, life-sustaining

declining. However, life-sustaining medical visits to dialysis and chemotherapy/radiation are treatments that can never be paused by a pandemic. Senior Rides and More increased these weekly rides to our care receivers in need when programs such as American Red Cross and American Cancer Society suspended their own medical transportation services.

As our care receivers began selfquarantining at home, they were becoming more and more isolated. The mental health effects caused by isolation became a concern for the Senior Rides staff. We encouraged

our seniors to call us just to chat, and we made several phone-calls each day to our care receivers to check on their wellbeing. It is amazing how a few minutes socializing over the phone with someone can lift one's spirits. If you have not spoken to a friend or relative in some time, I encourage you to pick up the phone today and call them.

As we put 2020 behind us and look forward to a (hopefully!) brighter 2021, we need to give a huge shout out to our incredible volunteers. Without these selfless and dedicated people, our program

Therefore, keep this in mind ... the care receivers we add to our program this year are just a fraction of those who have contacted us and need assistance. As Houston's senior population grows, so will Senior Rides and More. We know that we are making a difference in people's lives. Won't you join us?

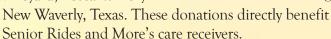

them to dine on Inge's home
cooked German-inspired

handcrafted Texas wine made
from grapes grown at their
vineyard, Tosca Winery in



In 2020, their in-person fundraising came to a halt due to Covid19 safety restrictions. Inge-Lotte is not one to desert a mission. If her friends and neighbors could not come to her, she would go to them. In April of 2020, which is when she and Willie host friends from The Buckingham to visit their Tosca Winery and have Inge's homemade lunch among

the Bluebonnets, Inge decided that if her neighbors could not make the trip to Tosca Vineyards for lunch, she would bring the lunch to them. For a donation

to Senior Rides and More, Inge prepared home-cooked lunches and hand-delivered them to her neighbors. In December 2020, the community was still in quarantine and Inge's holiday dinner fundraiser was now canceled. This did not stop Inge-Lotte from raising money for Senior Rides! Inge turned her kitchen into a bakery and for weeks she baked delicious German breads and treats to sell to her neighbors to benefit Senior

Rides and More. These amazing holiday baked goods were lovingly gift wrapped and hand delivered by Inge-Lotte, all to support our seniors.

Inge is an example of how we can think outside the box and creatively work around limitations. Thank you, Inge-Lotte for your creative thinking and your hard work to raise funds that will directly benefit our seniors with transportation to their doctors and help with groceries.
